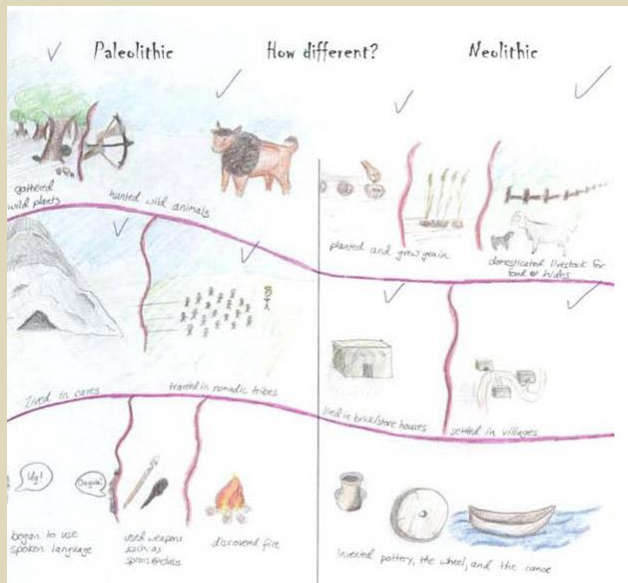

Oklahoma A+ educators from across the state met in Tulsa for the annual Spring Mini-Institute event.

"We are exploring new tools and resources for communication, effective leadership and learning. Not only is this event a touchstone for connecting as the Oklahoma network of creative schools, but also for sharing new information and practice," said OK A+ Program Director Rosalynn Wade.

Wilson began its Spring family night two years ago and rotates between literacy and math connections. The first year's title was "WE are family" and included making books. The next year's title was "WE got the beat" and included math games and take-home games for families.

Each year, a DJ, music and prizes add to the fun at family night. Food is provided by Wilson's community partner, BancFirst.

"It's like a giant family block party and parents start asking about it in the fall," said Wilson Elementary Principal Sandy Kent.

Kent says they structure the time wisely so everyone is involved and there is an emphasis on learning in the fun.

"It takes a lot of collaboration to get it all done, but it is certainly worth every bit of effort when we see the families enjoying learning together," said Kent.

Coordinators exchanged best practices of the A+ Essentials™, learned ways to creatively engage all learners and addressed the need to continue relevance in their daily practice. Coordinators are teachers who serve as their school's representative to effectively communicate professional development needs to the OK A+ office.

Principals received a free copy of [The Element by Sir Ken Robinson](#). "One of the world's leading thinkers on creativity and innovation," Sir Ken is an active advocate of Oklahoma A+ Schools. Using [OK A+ Linwood Elementary](#) in Oklahoma City as an example of "Making the Grade," Sir Ken discusses how the philosophy and practices found in Oklahoma A+ Schools lead to the kinds of enriched school environments that help students and teachers discover their "Element."

"Nothing could be better for our children in schools than to be taught by people who are passionate about what they are doing and feel that all children deserve a rich, connected and relevant school experience," said Hendrickson.



As the Spring Mini-Institute drew to a close, principals and coordinators collaborated to discuss ways to take back these experiences to their schools' staff. Their ideas spanned everything from poetry to online tools and theatre to visual art.

"This experience was relevant to my practice because it helped me refocus on the importance of the whole child," said an OK A+ Principal.
